

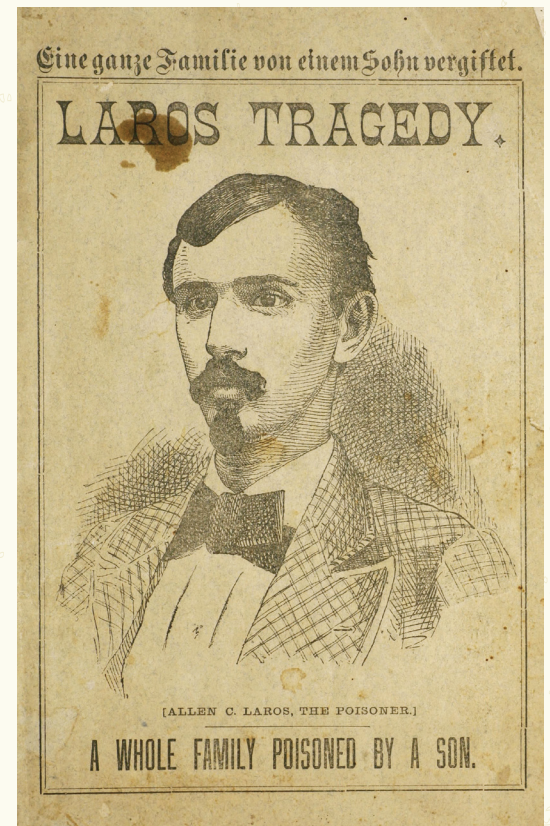
# Crime, Punishment, and Popular Culture, 1790-1920

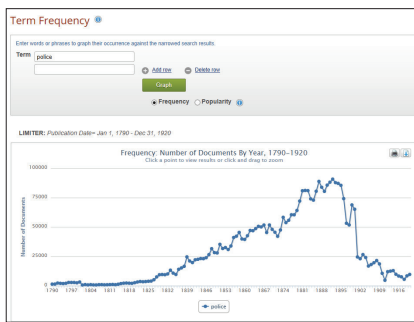

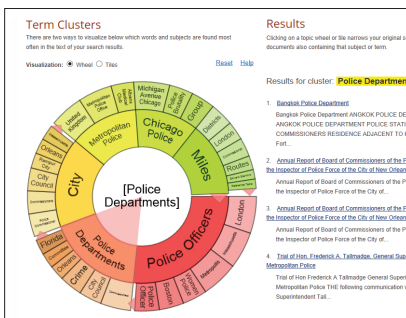

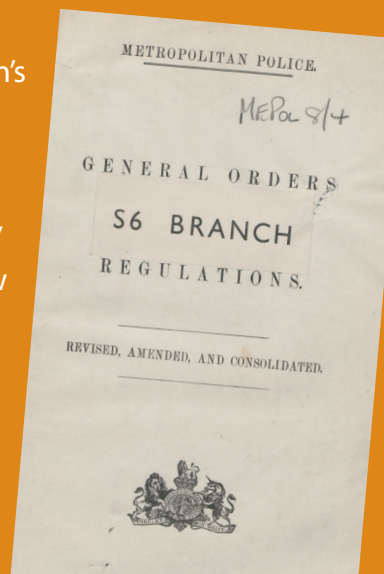
## Term Clusters
